Colorado native Anne Munch is a subject matter expert in the fields of sexual assault and domestic violence. She attended University of Denver for both her undergraduate degree in psychology and sociology as well as her law degree. Anne's legal career has been spent both in the courtroom and in the classroom, first as a prosecutor in Colorado for thirteen years specializing in crimes of interpersonal violence and next as a professional speaker, trainer and consultant. In addition to her work as an attorney, Anne worked in the advocacy field as the director of the San Miguel Resource Center, a domestic violence and sexual assault response program in Telluride, CO and directed the Colorado Ending Violence Against Women Project, a statewide multi-disciplinary training and technical assistance project.

Currently Anne Munch is the president of Anne Munch Consulting, Inc. where she provides speaking, training and consulting services to a wide range of organizations. Anne regularly provides keynote addresses at local, national and international conferences. She is a well-known expert in her field, and provides her services to local, national and military organizations across the United States, Asia and Europe as well as to US colleges and universities. As a primary focus, Anne trains criminal justice professionals in the investigation, prosecution and response to sexual assault and other crimes of interpersonal violence. She has worked extensively with the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response programs for the military and co-developed the first Bystander Intervention program for the US Air Force as well as the two-week Sexual Assault Special Victims Unit Investigations Course for the US Army.
